- Focus: School improvement.
- Positive Behaviour Intervention Supports (PBIS):
- Posters created to outline expectations for different areas of the school.
- Developed a staff-wide matrix with the motto: "Bears are safe, respectful, and responsible."
- Example: "In the bathroom, if bears are safe, what does that look like?"
- Approach: Teach, model, and reinforce expectations across grade levels to create a universal structure.
- Timeline: Final matrix to be shared with staff on Friday, December 6th, then rolled out to students and the PSSC for finalization.

- Focus: Annual school review using quality indicators.
- Suggestion: Review Year-over-Year data to guide discussions.

- Literacy Professional Learning
- Principals attended literacy sessions, highlighting the need for further sessions.

- Bus & Bell Times Consultation
- Open to parents, students, employers, and extracurricular activity providers.
- Accessible once per device.
- Scheduled for December 2, 3, and 10.
- Details shared via email from ASD-W Communications.
- DEC Budget Update
- The district is over budget, primarily due to employing over 100 more Educational Assistants
- (EAs) than allocated in the budget.

## Academic Excellence & Provincial Assessments

- Provincial Assessments: Released, but one file was duplicated on the site.
- Trends: Overall scores are declining.
- Focus Group: Established to identify underlying issues (e.g., fewer than 50% of Grade 4 students passed the literacy test).
- Key challenges:
- Newcomer Population & Special Needs: Accommodations are requested but not always effective.
- Testing Format: Online testing may lead to disengagement as results do not affect grades.
- Exemptions: Lack of standardization.
- Data Inconsistencies: Science scores are higher than literacy, even though the former is literacybased.
- Education Minister's Comments: Decline in Grade 4 literacy attributed to an influx of students (ESL and others) overwhelming teachers.
- Timeline: Hoping for a readout later this year, though no date confirmed.
